

## Track 1 - Organise Satellite Events



**Date:** 27-28 March 2023

**Location:** All over South Africa

**Last day to apply:** 8 January 2023

Satellite events (for example workshops, seminars, guest lectures, visits, industry collaboration etc.) can be organised by researchers or jointly in collaboration with nearby universities or organisations linked to research, education or innovation. These events can include students, researchers, industry, NGOs, university management or any relevant groups.

This is the possibility to involve a great amount of researchers at your own universities, since funds for travel will not be needed.

3 different tracks of participation

*In this iteration of the SASUF Research and Innovation week, we have broadened the possibility to participate in events throughout the week. There are three different tracks of participation, and you are asked to only submit an application for one of them. The different tracks are the following:*

## Call for hosting a satellite event during the 5th SASUF Research and Innovation Week **Deadline 08 January 2023**

The South Africa – Sweden Research and Innovation Week (27-31 March 2023) consists of two parts: Satellite events (Monday-Tuesday) and the South Africa – Sweden Sustainability Forum (Wednesday-Friday).

The **satellite events** (smaller workshops, seminars, guest lectures, visits, industry collaboration etc.) can be organised by researchers, universities or any other organisation linked to research, education or innovation.

Based on previous experience, we encourage satellite events to be co-organised jointly within the university and in collaboration with other universities in the same province. This has previously proven to help generate a greater dissemination and a broader audience.

Satellite events can include students, researchers, industry, NGO:s, university management or any relevant groups. Satellite events can take place across South Africa.

**Call deadline:** 08 January, 2023

### **Satellite Events are for those who:**

- Aim to have a half day/full day workshop/session/event
- Aim to provide a first hand experience on campus, in a research facility, at an industry, etc.
- Showcase a local/regional phenomenon
- Events that take more time than 1-2 hours
- Established projects can have presentation/dissemination of established projects
- Alumni events, networking sessions, research focused workshops, cultural events, etc.
- An opportunity to showcase what's close to YOUR heart

Researchers taking part in the week are encouraged to get involved in the organisation of satellite events by filling out this call for satellite events.

The Satellite Event will be reviewed on the basis of: having a potential to attract attendees from other SASUF universities, the content and structure can be broadly disseminated and understood, having a format that allows inclusion and/or engagement from new colleagues, be in line with the local SASUF priorities within the host university/universities.

The Satellite Event will each be reviewed by the local SASUF team at the university.

### **Logistics and Funding**

When selected – The organiser(s) are responsible for registration and logistics. These events are locally funded, hence you will need to communicate with your own University\* about the possibility to cover smaller costs for the arrangement. Hosting a satellite event during the SASUF Research and Innovation Week does not necessarily need to be an expensive event. Please note that an acceptance of hosting a satellite event does not automatically provide you with funding from your institution, since there is no central funding from SASUF for hosting this. 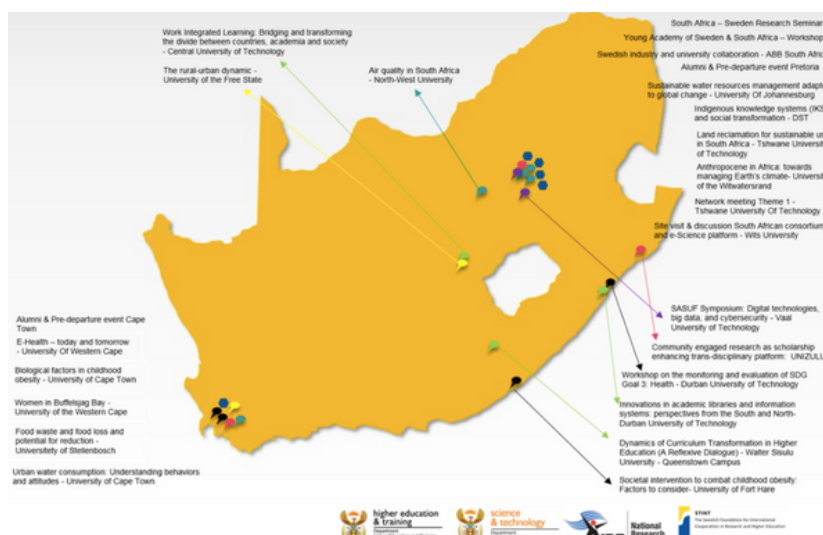
